Bylaws – Second Amendment

This Second Amendment is a complete restatement of the Beach Cities Cycling Club Bylaws and supersedes all the prior Bylaws. The Second Amendment is made and entered into on the date signed below, by and through the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE I. NAME

This corporation shall be known as the Beach Cities Cycling Club, Incorporated.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

This corporation is organized exclusively for one or more of the purposes as specified in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The specific objectives and purposes of this corporation shall be:

1. Provide bicycle safety education to the community;
2. Establish partnerships with the local school districts to teach and encourage bicycle safety to children;
3. Advocate and publicize the development of bicycle routes, lanes and signage to promote safer communities and to ease tensions between motorists and bicyclists;
4. Promote fundraising events for charity; and
5. Encourage bicycling as healthy outdoor recreation sport.

ARTICLE III. ADMINISTRATION

The principal office shall be maintained in the City of Redondo Beach, County of Los Angeles, State of California.

The affairs of the corporation shall be conducted by a Board of Directors ("Board") which shall consist of five (5) members who shall be elected by the members of the corporation. The Board shall consist of a President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Member at Large ("Board Members").
