Articles of Incorporation

Article I

The name of this corporation is Beach Cities Cycling Club, Incorporated.

Article II

This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law for public and charitable purposes.

Article III

The purpose of this corporation is to:

1. Provide bicycle safety education to the community;
2. Establish partnerships with the local school districts to teach and encourage bicycle safety to children;
3. Advocate and publicize the development of bicycle lanes, paths and signage to promote safer communities and to ease tensions between motorists and cyclists;
4. Promote fundraising events for charity; and
5. Encourage bicycling as healthy outdoor recreation

Article IV

The organization is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article V

Article VI

This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code § 501 (c) (3).


Article VII

No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate or intervene in any political campaign (including the publishing or distribution of statements) on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Article VIII

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member thereof or to the benefit of any private person. Upon the dissolution or winding up of the corporation its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Internal Revenue Code section 501(c)(3).
